F.E. Warren Air Force Base



We were contacted by a family living on the Base who believed that they were experiencing some kind of paranormal activity.

History:

Warren Air Force Base is the oldest continuously active military base in the continental United States. It was opened in 1867 as Ft. D.A. Russell a home to the U.S. Calvary. Today it is the home to over one hundred strategic and tactical nuclear weapons.

Reported activity on Base:

The most common ghostly sighting is that of seeing cavalrymen from the 19th century. During the 1980's Staff Sergeant Edward Davis encountered a cavalry officer who greeted him with a "good evening," he responded with a "howdy" then vanished

One of the older houses on base was home to a service family whose daughter awakened in the night to see a cavalry officer standing in her playroom. A Captain once lived in the home and was killed falling from a second story window while trying to escape when his family came home early to find him and his mistress upstairs. The captain has been reported in the house by numerous people over the years.

Another home on base is rumored to be haunted by a young girl. When the residents were away on vacation the neighbor saw her staring in the front window. They have two sons and no girls.

Security officers continuously drive to the silos to perform checks and have reported seeing a Native Americans on horseback on the prairie.

An area next to the location we are investigating has a dark history: Cavalrymen raped and then bludgeoned to death a Native American woman. Her screams have been reported to base security officers several times, but when patrols go to investigate nothing is found.

At the General's quarters, former residents said that a cavalryman and his dog haunt the home. When a new General and his family move in and try to remove a certain picture frame from an attic wall they are guaranteed nights with unusual noises and a dog barking until the frame is replaced.

Case Claims:

Paul and Jane moved into their property in July of 2005. It is a two story detached residence owned by the military. Paul is serving as a member of the USAF and Jane is a nurse and works in the medical field. They have a son that we will call David who is eight years old.

We were unable to track down the former occupants of the home, but did talk to the neighbors who say that the only problem is that their toilet seat seems to rise up when nobody is in the house.

On August 20, 2005, Jane was walking down the staircase when she encountered what she described as a Native American male somewhere from 40-50 years old. He had a jowly face, which looked "very disapproving, like he caught me with my hand in the cookie jar." The man's hair was long and thinning, oily black and tied back. He was wearing a t-shirt, but Jane could not remember what kind of pants he was wearing. Jane screamed and ran into the bathroom locking the door. She insists that she could hear a loud female voice crying and screaming while she was locked in there. As noted earlier, outside the home is the campground where there are similar reports.

In September, Paul came home from duty and noticed a dark human shaped shadow standing in the front window. When he entered the house, nobody was present. Then Paul witnessed a small black shadow "dog sized" move from down the hallway at high speed, make a sharp 90-degree turn left turn into the kitchen and the disappeared through the closed and locked back door. No animals were present in the home at the time. It is a matter of the official record that the military police were called out for a possible home intrusion and swept the house for intruders but found nothing. On departing, the Sergeant told Paul that this was "not an unusual situation" at Warren.

During November, David the son was terrified one night by the apparition of a Caucasian mal of unknown age standing behind his chair in the bedroom. We immediately separated David from his parents to question him alone. He gave a very precise description of the man in the room, which matched the description of from Paul. David described the man as having grey hair and a long beard, with a modern style blue work shirt and jeans. The man was a "nice guy, he was kind of smiling." David stated that the man walked across the room to the window and disappeared.

Since this occurrence, David refuses to be separated from his parents, sitting outside the bathroom door when his mother is inside and demanding that he be able to sleep with his parents. Since this disturbance, events have increased in frequency. Now Jane refuses to come downstairs alone for water at night. They travel in pairs when in the home.

Over the past six weeks, footsteps are heard on the staircase at night. The cupboard doors and drawers in the kitchen open and close by themselves and can be heard slamming at night when the family is in bed. One morning in December, Paul and Jane came downstairs to find an unknown material smeared over the refrigerator. The substance is brown and red, and appears

to spell "Go Now" in the opinion of the family. The substance had a "sweet smell" and Paul spent the morning going through the contents of the kitchen trying to identify the substance. He could not find a match.

Paul and Jane have recently acquired two dogs that have started to stare into the air and chase an invisible "something" around the bedroom. Objects have begun to disappear, sometimes permanently (some cookware) and sometimes return in a different room (a hammer). On one occasion, a candle was burning when Paul came home but Jane claims that she did not light it. Cold spots are frequent, with Paul describing the atmosphere as feeling "like a meat locker" several times.

The investigation:

We arrived to the location around four in the afternoon. It was an exceptionally windy day, which meant listening for any "unusual" noises would be difficult. The forecast called for gusts of up to 50mph all night.

We started the investigation around 7 p.m.

The entire upper floor of the house was wired with microphones, video cameras, and thermometers. EMF baselines were taken and monitored all evening. There were no unusual EMF readings.

Observers were placed in the child's bedroom, on the stairs and downstairs throughout the night. The only unusual occurrence was a window opening seemingly by itself in the master bedroom. Once it was closed, it remained that way.

Conclusion:

The weather condition during the investigation made it impossible to determine if there were any unusual noises or movements that could be observed. The home has a large quantity of personal experiences however nothing substantial as far as evidence.

While we would like to return, the family has moved to another home.
